At the beginning of our sixteenth year of operation at San Miguel Program (SMP) we pause for a moment to ponder the words of the famed abolitionist who worked tirelessly to advance the equality of all people. One hundred and fifty years after that speech our United States is in the midst of unrest and turmoil. What we see on the evening news belies the calm and happiness that have permeated the halls of San Miguel Academy since our boys returned in June for the Summer Scholars Program. With masks and social distancing, each boy immediately returned to business as usual, content to be in their "safe zone" where learning is exciting and exploration is rewarded with new discoveries.



"Educate your sons and daughters," said Douglass. Such is our mission, to break the cycle of poverty through education, so to create greater access to the American Dream. Our vision is simple, to lead in urban education. We demonstrated that leadership on March 19, 2020, when our teachers hit the ground running with live classrooms. At home, each boy was given the resources necessary to be engaged in the learning process online for more than six hours each day for the remainder of the academic year. Hardly a school in our nation could match the quality of what our staff delivered. And now with the return of in person summer learning, SMP continues to lead in urban education.

Cory was burned over 90% of his body and was airlifted back to the USA, by the quick thinking of his mother, where he was taken to Westchester Medical Center. Of interest, Cory was born prematurely at WMC back in 2002, weighing less than two pounds. This young man is known for overcoming the odds! Presently, Cory continues to rehabilitate at Burke Rehab in White Plains, New York. Cory has his eye on Virginia Military Institute where he was accepted into the Class of 2024, hoping to join the Class of 2025 next autumn. With the



intense love of his family and the prayers of so many, doctors are expecting that Cory will regain his full strength and vitality sooner than anyone expected.

The *Boys in the Boat* author, Daniel James Brown, was notified about Cory's accident. The bestselling author quickly inscribed a book to Cory (above) and sent off to him for encouragement. In case you cannot see the inscription it reads, "Cory, we are all in the boat with you – pulling for you, pulling with you. Row on!" DJB

Most suspect that the rigors of rowing contributed to the enormous strength upon which Cory is relying during his recovery.




