Those who have long worked in the trades, along with many of our local unions, are innovating new ways to attract skilled laborers. Currently, the unions are taking a page out of our U.S. military R.O.T.C. Program and the G.I. Bill by offering to potential apprentices a blend of college education along with skills training. No longer does it have to be an either/or situation, but rather one can learn how to become an electrician while also taking a college degree in business.

To add to this new awareness by the unions, our excellent SUNY college system has also recognized that there are many students seeking majors in agriculture, H.V.A.C., construction management,

and building maintenance. Schools like SUNY Alfred and SUNY Morrisville offer a wide array of non-traditional majors in fields where there is a high demand for workers. Currently, we have two boys studying at SUNY Morrisville.

Another important component of our Graduate Success Program is internships. With a growing number of companies committing to efforts in diversity, equity, and inclusion, many of our boys have had internships in business and banking. Through the years, Melissa Mineau and Gus Sacco of Hudson Valley Investment Advisors have loyally hosted our boys as interns. Currently, Henry Nataren, SMA '17, is working part time with H.V.I.A. while matriculating at SUNY New Paltz. Henry's life is busy but with the benefit of a paid internship, he can afford to pay his tuition bills without taking any student loans! Michael Gilfeather of Orange Bank and Trust has also been a faithful proponent of interning our graduates. This summer, Avante Walker, SMA '15, enjoyed a paid internship at the Middletown executive offices of OBT. We are grateful to all who have hosted our graduates and at the same time, we know that many of our supporters may also be aware of internships in New York City that will host our alumni. # Cory... the rest of the story!

In last summer's alumni update we reported the devastating news that Cory Arias, SMA '16, St. Benedict's Prep '20, had been electrocuted with 10,000 volts of power, shortly after his high school graduation. Doctors at Westchester Medical Center informed Cory's family that it is rare that a human body can sustain such injuries and recover. We all joined with Cory and did the one thing we knew best, we prayed! Almost exactly two months after the accident Cory emerged from the hospital, ready to start his life again. He credits his amazing recovery to the deep love of his family and friends, the many prayers offered on his behalf, and the fact that he was in such great physical shape because of four years of high school rowing. Coach Craig White, Cory's rowing coach at St. Benedict's Prep, said that he has seldom seen a student commit at such a high level to the sport.

Cory still needed time to heal from the 90% of his body that had been scarred by second and third degree burns, and so beginning studies at Virginia Military Institute in the Fall of 2020 would not be possible. In the meantime, Cory needed something to fill the empty hours of the day. Since we were looking for a rowing coach at the very same time, it became apparent that Cory was going to be back at his alma mater middle school!




## **High School Graduations!**
