Twenty years ago, we told our first group of "believers" that we were going to break the cycle of poverty through education in the City of Newburgh. That lofty mission needed a team of supporters, educators, workers, pray-ers, and collaborators who would be willing to work tirelessly for love of God and neighbor.

Over 300 families have benefited from the impact of San Miguel Program. We have had our share of highlights – high school graduation rate of 97%, international acclaim for our place-based learning program, high school mission partners including some of the most elite secondary schools in the nation, a nationally known middle school rowing program, THREE Naval Academy Appointments from one class, trades education partners, and an emerging aviation program that is creating pilots, mechanics and traffic controllers for a beleaguered industry.

Thank you to all who are reading this message, and special appreciation to those of you who have been on this amazing twenty-year journey with us!








himself, also worked closely with USNA admissions for several years. His guidance through the years has helped to influence many of our boys to consider a career in military service.
